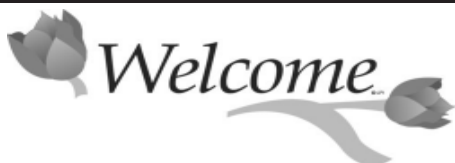

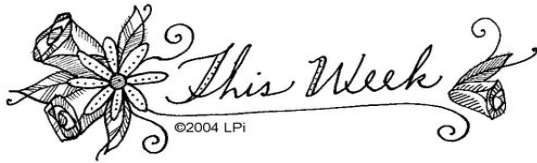

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Do you believe that you are supposed to be Christ in this world today? You're baptized in his name. You call yourself a Christian. You sign yourself with holy water and make the sign of the cross. Do you really believe that the Spirit of God is upon you?

Sometimes it's hard to conceive that. We can get ourselves into a baptismal inferiority complex: I'm not good enough to think that I can be Christ in this world. Only extraordinarily holy people-saints-can be like Christ. Thinking like that can lead to baptismal suicide-drowning in the waters of baptism without ever experiencing the power of the Resurrection. Paul doesn't mince any words this week when he tells the Corinthians, "You are Christ's body." He can say that because we have all been given of the one Spirit.

So, if you're baptized you have the Spirit of God, just like Jesus in today's Gospel. That Spirit of God sends us to bring good news to the poor, "to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free."

WOW! What a task. It sounds impossible. As a matter of fact, it is-if we tried to do it alone. But we don't have to. We can do all those things-and more-because we are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, through one Spirit. How we work that out in each community is part of the discernment of the Spirit that takes place, discovering the best ways to use each person's talents and gifts. God's Spirit is given for the common good, and it is in the community of faith that each of us discovers the ways that God wants us to fulfill our baptismal call. ©2009 Liturgical Publications Inc

2nd quake hits Haiti

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti - A 6.1-magnitude earthquake struck Haiti on Wednesday morning, shaking buildings and sending screaming people running into the streets only eight days after the country’s capital was devastated by an apocalyptic quake. The U.S. Geological Survey said the new quake hit at 6:03 a.m. (1103 GMT) about 35 miles (56 kilometers) northwest of the capital of Port-au-Prince. It struck at a depth of 13.7 miles (22 kilometers) but was too far inland to generate any tidal waves in the Caribbean. Wails of terror rose Wednesday as frightened survivors of last week’s quake poured out of unstable buildings. It was not immediately possible to ascertain what additional damage the new quake may have caused. Last week’s magnitude-7 quake killed an estimated 200,000 people in Haiti, left 250,000 injured and made 1.5 million homeless. A massive international aid effort has been launched, but it is struggling with logistical problems, and many Haitians are still desperate for food and water. Still, search-and-rescue teams have emerged from the ruins with some improbable success stories - including the rescue of 69-year-old ardent Roman Catholic who said she prayed constantly during her week under the rubble. Ena Zizi had been at a church meeting at the residence of Haiti’s Roman Catholic archbishop when the Jan. 12 quake struck, trapping her in debris. On Tuesday, she was rescued by a Mexican disaster team. Zizi said after the quake, she spoke back and forth with a vicar who also was trapped. But he fell silent after a few days, and she spent the rest of the time praying and waiting. “I talked only to my boss, God,” she said. “I didn’t need any more humans.” Please join us and be a generous as possible in a free will offering at each Mass this weekend. 3er Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Por medio del año litúrgico los cristianos tenemos la oportunidad de ir descubriendo la verdad contenida en el Evangelio, que es la palabra de Dios. En este tercer domingo del tiempo ordinario tenemos una gran oportunidad de descubrir algo muy importante: ¡el mismo Jesús es la buena noticia! Lo que Jesús leyó en la sinagoga de Nazaret refiriéndose a su persona fue su programa de evangelización y salvación tan esperado para y por los pobres. Él tomó como base las palabras del profeta Isaías de ocho siglos antes. En labios de Jesús estas eran palabras vivas y deseadas. ¿Se imaginan la confusión al escuchar su mensaje de libertad e igualdad para todos?

Pero en la sociedad actual, ¿estamos deseosos de esta palabra de liberación? ¿Entendemos bien lo que Jesús anuncia? ¿Estamos oprimidos o somos libres? Con todo lo que estamos viviendo a veces no vemos o escuchamos los regalos que el Señor nos ofrece. Él siempre nos da "el año de gracia". O sea, las oportunidades nuevas para reconciliarnos los unos a los otros, entre culturas, entre pueblos, y entre familias. El Papa Juan Pablo II en la Jornada Mundial de la Paz en 1994 dijo: "en un clima hostil por la indiferencia y envenenado frecuentemente por el odio, ¿cómo esperar que venga una era de paz, que sólo los sentimientos de solidaridad y amor pueden hacer posible?" Hoy puede ser nuestro comienzo a una realidad nueva. Fijemos los ojos en Jesús: veamos lo que nos ofrece. Seamos personas de compromiso. Contribuyamos en el lugar que estemos. Sólo así cambiaremos el mundo para que viva la justicia y la paz que Jesús inició.
