Musings

Of the three characters in the parable that we hear, the one that we should probably keep our eyes on is the father. By looking at his words and conduct we shall learn an important lesson of this parable: the actions of the father are in harmony with the conduct of God.

“While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him.” He does not listen to the little speech his son begins to recite. He has only one concern: to clothe him with the best robe and quickly prepare a feast “because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.” This degree of excitement and agitation lively expresses the eagerness of the father, who forestalls any words or actions on his son’s part. We can imagine him saying, “You are here; this is enough; let us celebrate your return; we will talk of all this later.” This is Jesus’ response to those who grumble, “This is how God is.”

To the other son the father said, “You are here with me always; everything I have is yours.” This is all he says to his angry son. “No, I am not doing you any wrong. You are, and remain, my older son. But my heart is big enough for me to love your brother too, without taking anything away from my love for you. You have to understand that we must celebrate and rejoice. Enter wholeheartedly into the joy of the feast!”

Did the older son hear this last invitation of his father, or not? What was finally his response? The parable says nothing about it; it remains open, incomplete. It is for each one of us to decide what this older sibling—who we all are—does.

4o Domingo de Cuaresma

Una de las más bellas partes de la Biblia es la parábola del hijo pródigo. El contexto de Lucas 15 sirve para explicar por qué Jesús gastaba su tiempo y energía llevando a cabo su ministerio con las personas marginadas de aquellos tiempos: los cobradores de impuestos, las prostitutas, y los pecadores. La Cuaresma nos ofrece esta parábola invitándonos así al arrepentimiento y al perdón ofrecidos por el Padre amoroso y bueno de la historia.

Jesús, quien era un experto en el arte de la narración, presentó la historia dividida en tres partes. En la primera frase presenta a los tres personajes: "Un hombre tenía dos hijos". El más pequeño le pidió su herencia y se fue lejos donde despilfarró toda la fortuna de su herencia. Al quedarse solo y abandonado, sin amigos ni dinero, reflexionó y decidió pedir perdón a su padre. En la segunda parte vemos como el hijo humillado y vencido recibe el abrazo amoroso de su padre que lo encuentra con felicidad. En el tercer acto de la historia aparece el hijo mayor, quien al regresar del campo se da cuenta de que en su casa hay una fiesta. Uno de los sirvientes le dice que su hermano ha regresado y que su padre ha organizado una fiesta para celebrarlo. Con tremenda sorpresa se queda como decimos algunas veces: "paralizado". Enseguida le vienen los sentimientos de enojo y desilusión contra su padre. ¿Qué nos quiere enseñar el Señor Jesús con esta parábola? Sencillamente nos quiere mostrar el gran amor y la misericordia infinita de Dios.

BODAS
